### If you use commercial or private health insurance to pay for your medication



### Eligible patients pay \$5 per infusion

\$20,000 maximum program benefit per calendar year. There is no income requirement. Terms expire at the end of each calendar year and may change. See program requirements at [Remicade.JanssenCarePathSavings.com](https://www.Remicade.JanssenCarePathSavings.com). Program does not cover the cost to give you your infusion.
