If you use commercial or private health insurance to pay for your medication



Eligible patients pay \$0 per fill

\$12,500 maximum program benefit per calendar year for SYMTUZA®. \$7,500 maximum program benefit per calendar year for PREZISTA®, PREZCOBIX®, EDURANT®, and INTELENCE®. There is no income requirement.
