If you use commercial or private health insurance to pay for your Janssen medication



Eligible patients pay \$0 per month, subject to monthly program benefit limits

There is no limit to this benefit for your first month of treatment, and then a \$200 limit for each month thereafter. There is a \$3,000 maximum program benefit per calendar year. There is no income requirement. Terms expire at the end of each calendar year and may change. See program requirements at Invokana.JanssenCarePathSavings.com.
